HOW TO APPLY

Application Form Deadline: 1st November 2026

Then submit at least one A3 or A4 sketchbook to Mrs Charles by the Monday before the drawing assessment. The sketchbook must include:

- Tonal studies from direct observation (e.g., natural forms, portraits, mechanisms) in various media.
- Continuous line drawings (between 60 seconds and two minutes).
- Critical studies of artists' work, developed into personal studies.

To attend the observational drawing assessment at St Teresa's Senior School in mid November 2026.

Optional: Submit additional personal sketchbooks with other creative work.
