MUSIC CLUBS

The Music Department offers a full-range of musical activities, with excellence and inclusivity as its aims. Above all, the department is determined that the music making in the school is always a fun experience.

Individual lessons are available in a wide range of instruments, and peripatetic music teachers will help students prepare for ABRSM and Trinity music examinations. The department offers ABRSM music theory classes for all grades.

Ensembles during the year from September will include: trombone ensemble for beginners, the fanfare trumpet ensemble, the saxophone quartet, the jazz ensemble, African Drumming for beginners, flute ensemble, 'cello group, guitars for beginners, the classical trio, the Boogie Band for 6th Form, and the singing quartet.

Larger ensembles include, the School Orchestra and Lower School Orchestra, plus the String Ensemble.

There are numerous choirs throughout the school years, including the whole

Year 7 Choir, who perform in a whole year opera production, the wonderful Schola Cantorum, for all years (audition necessary) that sing at Evensong at school and Chichester Cathedral.

The Senior Choir is for Years 9–13 and no audition is needed. The Senior Chamber Choir is for Years 9–13 (audition needed).

Prefects organise an array of fun students groups which include a Social Music Club and an All Arts Club, incorporating Music, Drama and Literature.

The events of the school year include, termly concerts, termly soirées, a jazz evening, a classical concert, evensong, taking part in local festivals at Godalming and Leith Hill, the year 7 opera evening, the Interhouse Music Festival and the awarding of the Musician of the Year.

The biggest event is our annual choir tour. In years past, with over 40 girls, we have visited Barcelona, Verona, Vienna, Florence, Venice, Paris, Sicily, Athens, Perugia and Malta.

We are delighted to announce a new and exciting initiative at St Teresa's and Cranmore – the CCF (RAF)! The CCF (RAF) is based at 200 schools and colleges across the UK, where you can take part in Royal Air Force training and activities as part of your school life. You'll develop your confidence, responsibility, self-reliance, resourcefulness, endurance, and sense of service to the community. These qualities are vital to your success in whatever you do when you leave school or university.

Our headteachers have overall responsibility, but as a cadet you are a very real part of the Service – CCF is a partnership between St Teresa's, Cranmore and the Ministry of Defence. The Services all provide resources and training expertise for each CCF unit, and the RAF is no exception.

Cadets meet once a week throughout term time, after school for one-anda-half hours. In the school holidays you'll also have the chance to attend an annual camp at an RAF base to experience Service life up close.

Activities include gliding, air experience flights, Air Cadet Pilot Scheme, virtual reality simulators, adventure training, shooting, sports and great fun. We also plan to have a Cadet Marching Band – watch this space! Cadets can earn BTEC and DofE Awards and will learn leadership and discipline skills that will stand them in great stead in their careers.



DUKE OF EDINBURGH AWARD

The Duke of Edinburgh Award is a highly valued extra-curricular opportunity at St Teresa's. Every year students undertake Physical, Skill and Volunteering activities which help the local community and help students develop their skills. Physical

DYNAMIC ADVENTURES TRIPS

St Teresa's and Dynamic Adventures have been collaborating on adventure expeditions for over 22 years to help fulfil the girls' sense of wanderlust around the world. The trips are designed to stretch and challenge our students beyond the classroom whilst experiencing the awe and wonder of our beautiful planet. Trips become progressively more challenging as the girls progress through the school, with the final senior trip option offering the opportunity to volunteer on a conservation project or local community project, as well as lots of relaxation and sampling local culture and traditions.

- Years 9 & 10 have a 7–10 day trip to Iceland, Montenegro and other locations.

The girls have more input in the planning of this trip and get the opportunity to work with Dynamic Adventures in the lead up to the expedition at their headquarters in Dartington Hall, Devon.

SPORT

Physical education is an important part of life at St Teresa's. All of the girls enjoy taking part in a variety of sports during and outside of curriculum time. Our aim at St Teresa's is for your daughter to love being active and take that enthusiasm for sport into her life outside of school.

Our wide breadth of extra-curricular sporting activities is available for everyone, regardless of ability. Our top sportswomen are stretched and challenged in their particular fields whilst other girls are given opportunities to play and enjoy sport at a level appropriate to them. This year, we have partnered with

Guildford Hockey Club, Chelsea Football Club and Guildford Swimming

Club to provide additional top-level coaching for the girls. We have our own Equestrian Centre and stables (complete with horses!) at St Teresa's and Effingham Schools Tennis Academy (ESTA) coach our girls in tennis at every level at our dedicated Tennis Academy.

We have weekly fixtures for Years 3–6 against local schools in our main sports, which are hockey, netball, swimming, athletics, tennis and cricket. There are also opportunities to compete in cross country races, biathlons, aquathlons, football matches and horse riding competitions throughout the year.



Canoe Club

Canoe Club is a highlight of the Summer Term where the girls take to the water each week at Addlestone Canoe Club. This is led by our Head of PE who represented Great Britain in the 2009 Canoeing World Championships.

Gymnastics Club

The gymnastics club caters for all abilities, with the girls divided into groups according to their level. This enables each child to reach their full potential. All are welcome to join.

Guildford City Swim Club

Guildford City Swim Club was established in 1889 in association with the University of Surrey, a Swim England National Performance Centre. It is one of the largest and most successful swimming clubs in Great Britain and we are privileged to have their coaches at St Teresa's training our swim squads.

Chelsea Football Club

Chelsea FC Foundation's qualified coaching staff provide fun and safe sessions designed to help each individual improve their technique while having fun with their class mates.

Individual ball work, team activities and small sided matches make up each session.

Guildford Hockey Club

Guildford Hockey Club has long been known by its members and friends as a great place to play. They are a collection of people who have come together through a love of sport and in particular enthusiasm for the fast-paced, skilful game of hockey. Their coaches visit St Teresa's to provide the girls with top class hockey coaching.





DANCE

The girls can take ballet, tap and street dance lessons with **Inspire Academy** of **Dance** where lessons are designed to:

- nurture self-confidence;
- facilitate the children with the best possible training alongside enjoying every class;
- provide a happy and safe environment;
- inspire creativity;
- encourage a love of dance.

The Academy provides an excellent team of teachers many of whom have trained at some of the premier dance and stage schools in the country and have even performed on the stage in the West End.







MUSIC

The music department in the Prep School offers something for everyone, whilst striving for excellence and high standards. During an academic year, all children will take part in school events at Harvest and at Christmas. There is a Spring Concert for all girls in Upper Prep and an Easter Treat performance for Lower Prep girls; Year 5 and Year 6 girls perform in an end of year musical working in conjunction with the Drama Department.; and Year 6 girls are prepared for Music Scholarship auditions to the Senior School in January.

Classroom lessons are based around singing and practical music making giving each individual the chance to shine and progress. Year 3 girls learn the recorder and other year groups will be introduced to ukuleles and Djembe drums. Individual instrumental lessons are given by an experienced team of teachers who are also performing musicians. Lessons are available on a wide variety of instruments including bassoon and drum kit. ABRSM examinations are available at school every term. All girls are encouraged to learn a musical instrument.

Theory of Music Clubs

These clubs give the girls the opportunity to enhance their musical knowledge and complement their instrumental tuition. Each club is tailor made to a particular Grade so that the girls are challenged and moved on in their learning.

Orchestra

The orchestra is open to all girls who have achieved Grade 2 or above in their instrument. It is a wonderful opportunity for the girls to play in an ensemble and develop skills such as sight reading, playing in parts and following a conductor. There are numerous opportunities to perform throughout the year complemented by workshops with professional musicians and ensembles such as the Royal Holloway Orchestra.

String Orchestra

This is the perfect start for our string players before they move on to the full orchestra. Led by one of our resident string specialists, it caters for beginner strings as well as those who have taken grade examinations on violin, viola and 'cello. Parts are tailored to the girls' ability and this helps them to develop and achieve at their own level whilst aspiring to more challenging music.

String Quartet

There is currently a Year 4 quartet who are exploring the first stages of ensemble playing and working as a musical team. Other small groups are established according to the musical needs of the girls. These may vary from year to year.

Wind Band

Run by one of our woodwind specialists, this group enables wind, brass and percussion players to learn about ensemble playing and experience the joy of playing and learning in a group. Girls are put into the group as soon as staff feel they are ready and do not have to take any examinations before joining. As with String Orchestra, this is an excellent introduction to ensemble playing which helps to develop team work and musicality.

Chamber Choir

This is an auditioned choir for Years 5 and 6. It is aimed at those girls who have an excellent sense of pitch and harmony and can cope with a more challenging repertoire that includes singing in parts. Members of the Chamber Choir have recently had opportunities to attend workshops

with professional musicians eg Voces8 and John Rutter. The choir takes part in local and national competitions.

Young Voices Choir



This choir is open to all girls in Years 5 and 6 who enjoy singing, regardless of ability. The repertoire is varied but includes pop and rock styles as well as introducing the girls to some more traditional pieces. The aim of the choir is to perform at the O2 Arena as part of the Young Voices concert series.

St Teresa's Singers



This choir is open to all girls in Years 2, 3 and 4 and like the Young Voices Choir, is for girls who enjoy singing, regardless of ability. The repertoire is varied and includes a wide variety of songs with seasonal themes, actions and messages. There will be an opportunity for the choir to perform within the school environment.



FOREST SCHOOL

One of the benefits of our fantastic location is our proximity to nature and woodland. At Forest School, the girls visit our dedicated Forest School area and experience a variety of activities and woodland skills such as whittling, fire building and lighting, den building and studying and exploring the flora and fauna. The girls build resilience and a love for nature and wildlife.





THERE'S SOMETHING FOR EVERYONE!

Each class teacher offers an extracurricular club and these are a great opportunity for the girls to try something different that they may not have experienced before.

- Technology Club is a fun way for the girls to extend and apply their knowledge of technology. Amongst other things they learn and develop their coding skills and try their hands at stop motion animation. The girls grow in confidence and learn some essential skills that they can use in all areas of their lives.
- All girls are welcome at our Chess Club. If they've never tried chess before they can learn the basics, while the more experienced girls develop and hone their skills. The girls play against one another in fun matches and there are also opportunities to compete against other local schools and chess clubs.



At our Debating and Public Speaking Club the girls are encouraged to think critically about current affairs and topics of particular interest to them. They work in teams, formulating their arguments and writing their own speeches. They work on their presenting and debating skills, growing in confidence and poise. Each term culminates in an opportunity to speak in front of an audience or take part in a debate.





- Our Eco and Gardening Club highlights the values and importance of looking after nature and our planet. It is also an opportunity to learn some of the basics of gardening, planting, growing and garden maintenance in our beautiful school grounds.
- We have a very successful LAMDA programme where the girls can have LAMDA lessons (either Verse and Prose and/or Acting) working towards their LAMDA examination. We find that studying for and taking a LAMDA examination helps build confidence in public speaking and makes the girls more resilient.
- In Helping Hands Club, the girls explore ways in which they can help out in the community, with charities and in the wider world. These activities are the perfect way to develop the values of compassion, character and community.

- Our Quiz and Games Club aims to broaden general knowledge, inspire learning, reinforce teamwork and encourage strategic thinking in a fun, friendly atmosphere.
- In Problem Solving Club, the girls explore patterns, attempt challenges and solve problems with a mathematical twist.
- Our Poetry and Literature Club enables the girls to explore different genres of poems as well as extracts from both popular and classic books. They learn about classic and modern authors and poets and perform poetry, discuss literature and creating writing of their own.
- We also have an Art Club and an Art & Photography Club where the girls can learn a variety of skills and crafts, with some fabulous end results.



AFTER SCHOOL CARE

Our After School Care provision means that the girls can stay at school until 6pm which is a great asset to our working parents. Some families use this facility every day whilst others use it on an 'ad hoc' basis; we are extremely flexible so just let us know when you would like your daughter to attend. There is no charge for this provision.

Girls in Lower Prep take part in a range of different fun-filled activities, often themed around something topical; girls in Upper Prep have the opportunity to finish homework, read or take part in more informal activities such as board games or crossword puzzles.
